
## HE WAS A MAN OF "VISION"

ROPHET EZEKIEL was one of the four major Prophets of the Old Testament. He grew up in Jerusalem in the 6th century B.C. as a contemporary of the Prophet Jeremiah. Ezekiel was involved in the Babylonian exile in 597 B.C. and it was while living in captivity that Ezekiel began to distinguish himself with his gift of prophecy.

Ezekiel is well-known for his vivid visions, which often had Christian connotations. His famous vision of the "valley of the dry bones" has long been viewed as a foreshadowing of our Lord's teaching on the resurrection of the dead. He later predicted the destruction of Jerusalem, where only those marked with a Greek letter resembling a cross, would be spared.

Depicted on the cover of today's Church Bulletin is yet another of Ezekiel's visions. While praying at the banks of the river Chebar, the Prophet saw the heavens open up. A cloud appeared, surrounded by images of four living creatures. One had the face of a MAN, the second a LION, the third a CALF and the fourth an EAGLE. The Church has interpreted this as being a revelation of Christ, with the mysterious figures showing that He was both God and Man (as symbolized by the image of a man and a lion), Who was sacrificed for us (the calf) and Who ultimately resurrected and ascended into heaven (the eagle). It is important to note that the Four Evangelists are commonly depicted with these figures as the symbols of their particular version of the Gospel.

When he entered the house, the blind men came to him; and Jesus said to them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They said to him, "Yes, Lord." Then he touched their eyes, saying, "According to your faith be it done to you." And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly charged them, "See that no one knows it." But they went away and spread his fame through all that district. As they were going away, behold, a dumb demoniac was brought to him. And when the demon had been cast out, the dumb man spoke; and the crowds marveled, saying, "Never was anything like this seen in Israel." But the Pharisees said, "He casts out demons by the prince of demons." And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every disease and

every infirmity among the people. [RSV]

· What is Holy Communion?

The Eucharist is a personal encounter with the living Christ. This is where we meet Him and invite Him into our soul.

The Eucharist is the nuptial encounter of the soul with her Lord. It is a marriage union between Christ and the soul. In the words of Cyril of Jerusalem: "Christ has given to the children of the bridal chamber the enjoyment of His body and His blood." Another Church Father, Theodoret, writes, "In eating the elements of the Bridegroom and drinking His blood, we accomplish a marriage union." The Eucharist, then, becomes the marriage relationship through which the Bridegroom Christ, espouses the Church as His Bride, thus truly transforming a human community into the Church of God.

St. Ambrose says that when the body of Christ is placed on the lips of the believer, it is truly a kiss given by Christ to the soul, the expression of the union of love between the believer and his Lord.

The Eucharist is the Eschaton, the Omega, breaking into history. It is the inaugurated kingdom of God being made manifest. It is where heaven and earth meet. It is the Holy One, unapproachable in glory, bending down to touch us in love. It is the mystery of both the beyondness and the nearness of God coming alive for us. It is participating in the new life of Christ by partaking of the Precious Body and Blood of our Lord.

# PARAKLESIS TO THE VIRGIN MARY

Throughout our Church history, no woman has been more loved, more lauded and more cherished than the Blessed Virgin Mary. She herself foretold it: "For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed." (Luke 1:48) In beautiful poetic-hymnography, which is characteristic of Byzantine Chant in the Eastern Orthodox Church, the Theotokos, the Mother of God is honored and esteemed for her unique role in the salvation of the human race. Through her, the Word of God became flesh and the Infinite became, as it were finite. Humanity took on divine presence and Divinity took on humanity. The Theotokos is the vehicle, par excellence of humility and obedience and thus a supreme example of redeemed mankind.

As the Mother of our Lord, she is our greatest ally and our most fervent intercessor, "for...the prayer of the righteous has great power in its effects." (James 5:16) During the Paraklesis Service, we ask the Most Holy Theotokos to save us just as those drowning reach out to those on dry land. Let us then seek with confidence the help and intercession of the Mother of Light, Mary, the Mother of our Lord.

Let us also honor the Mother of our Lord, as many others before us have, by coming and participating in the Paraklesis Services, so that we can all praise the Mother of our Lord with Hymn and song.
